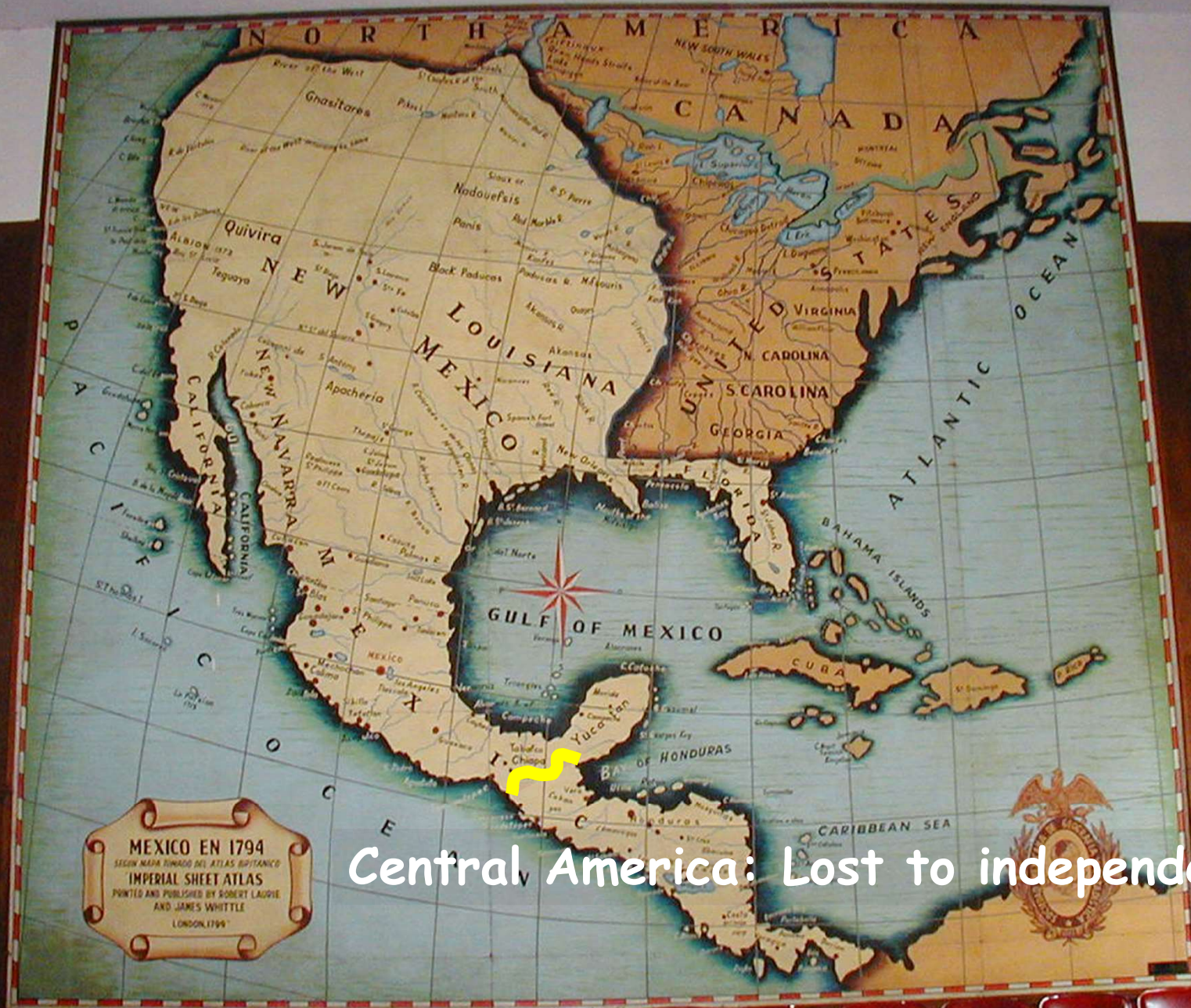

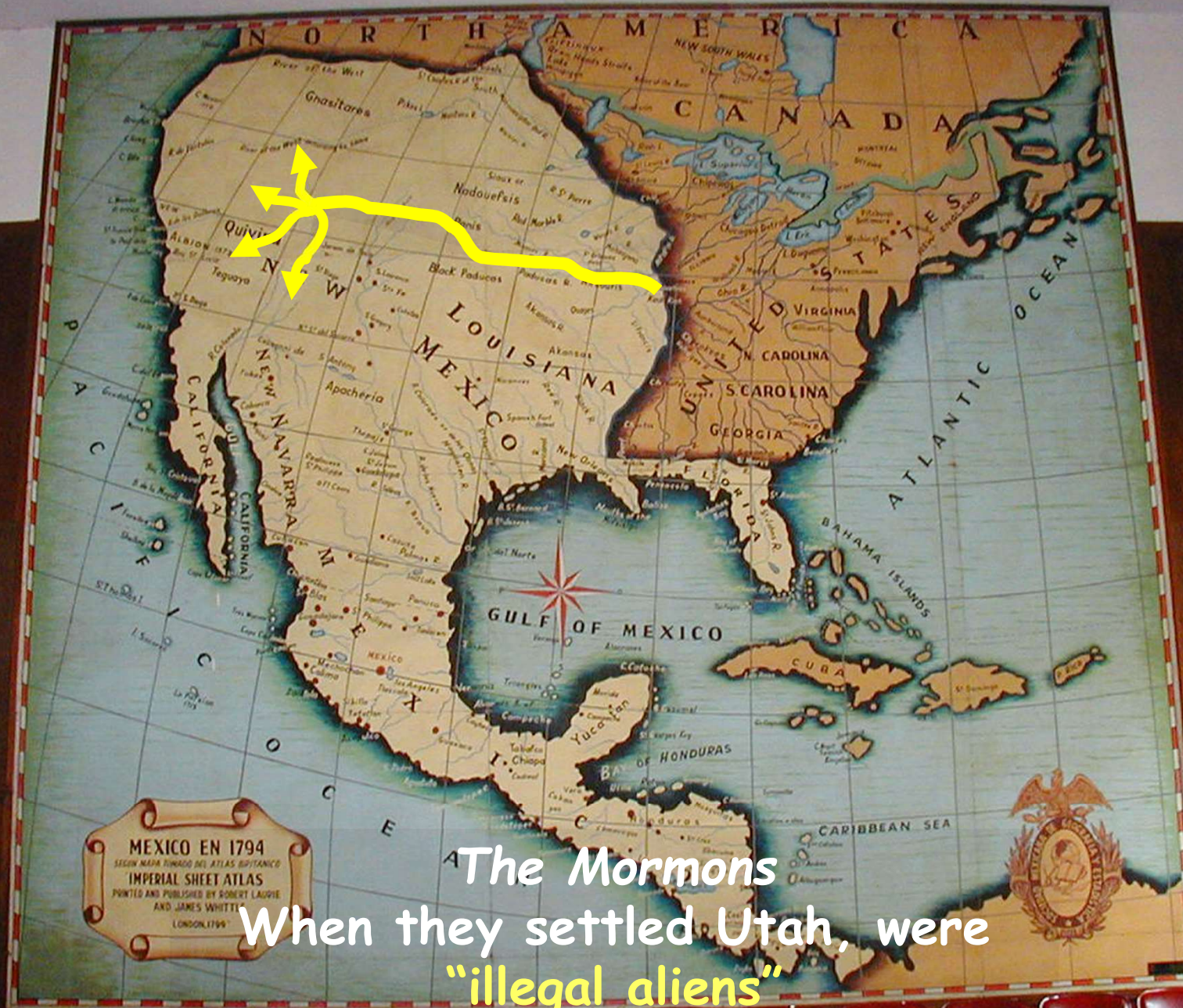
Lewis and Clark

"illegal aliens"



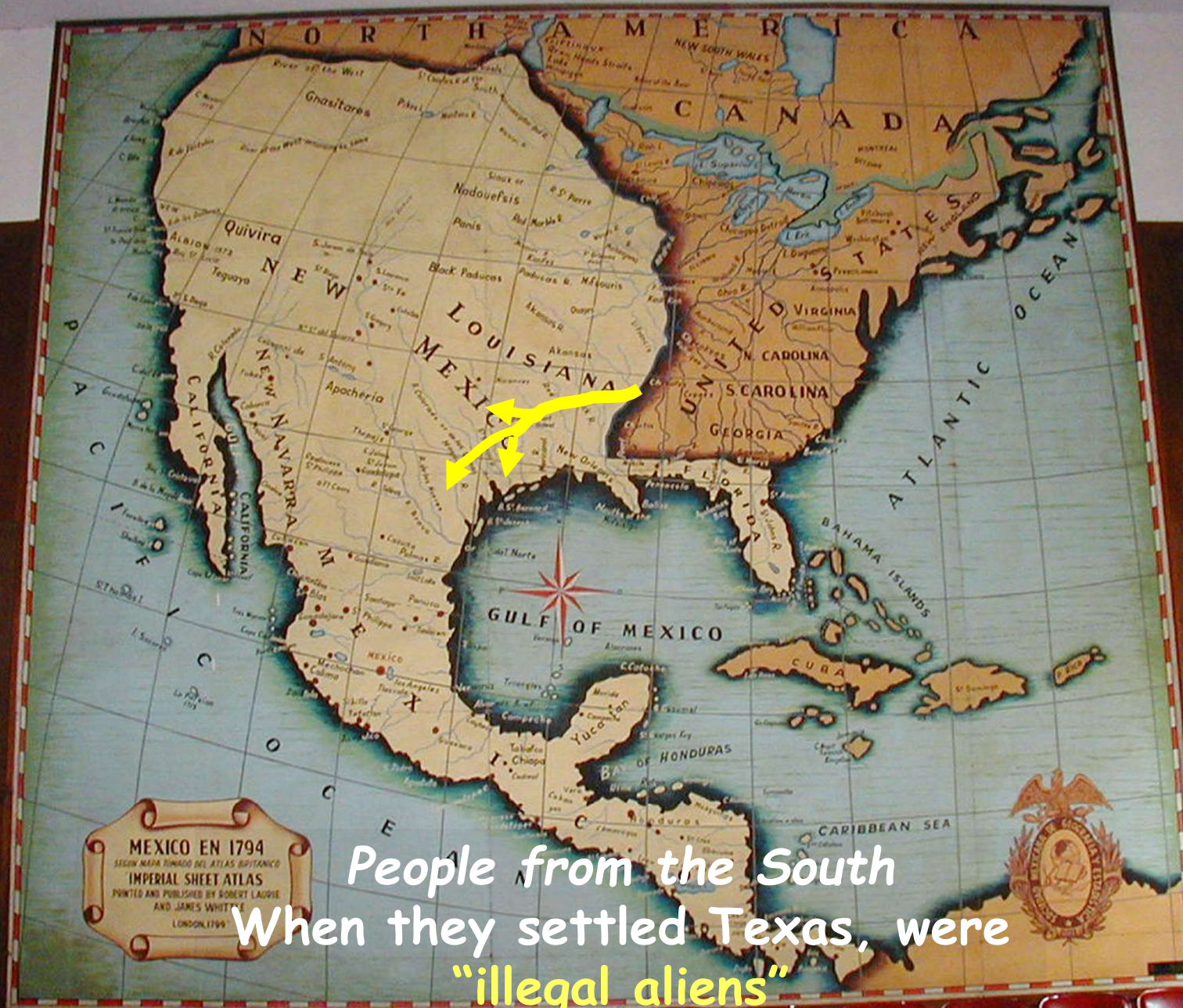
Kit Carson and Zebulon Pike

"illegal alien"

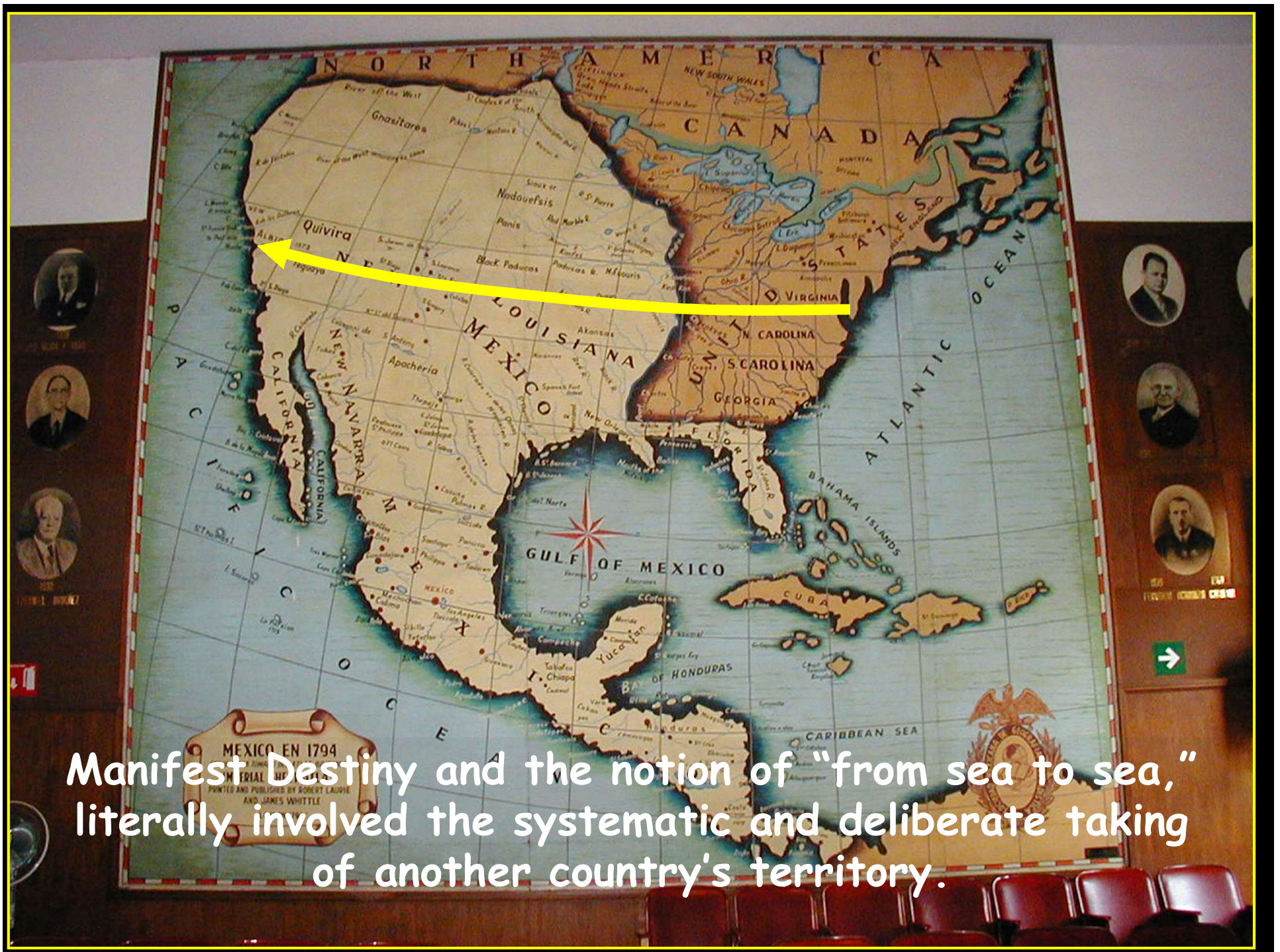


The Mormons
